Scholarship Eligibility

1. Must be a high school senior
2. Must plan to pursue post high school studies (2 or 4 year college/university)
3. Must be a resident of DFW Metroplex
4. Professional/Graduation Photo (wallet/passport size)
5. Official high school transcript with rank and GPA
6. Two letters of recommendation from any of the following: High School Teacher/Administrator/Counselor, Community Leader, Minister/Church Leader or Supervisor from work or Community Service Project (Recommendations should be addressed to the Scholarship Committee of Kappa Zeta chapter with a signature and contact information.)
7. Essay 500 words or less (*see specific scholarship for guidelines*)

***NOTE** Eligibility Requirements may differ for each scholarship. When applying please refer to the requirements specified for each scholarship. If you have any questions regarding the scholarship requirements please contact our Scholarship Chair.*

Official Rules

1. Scholarship recipients will be notified by email.
2. Submission of an application constitutes permission to use the recipient's name and/or likeness for purposes of advertising and scholarship solicitation.
3. The amount of the Scholarship Award varies yearly.
4. Only completed applications submitted by the deadline will be considered.

Fairilla E. White Scholarship

The Fairrilla Emory White Scholarship was established as a tribute to a historic black educator and charter member of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., Kappa Zeta Chapter. Mrs. White, born in Dallas on October 7, 1898, was to be cited as Dallas' "oldest living teacher of record" however, she passed just two days shy of the award presentation.

An education pioneer, Mrs. White graduated from Dallas' Colored High School in 1916 and Bishop College in Marshall, Texas in 1920. She taught at Southern University in Baton Rouge, LA and returned to Dallas in 1922. She taught math at Dallas' Fred Douglass and Phyllis Wheatley Elementary schools and, beginning in 1924, at Booker T. Washington High School.

Purpose

The scholarship is to be awarded to female high school seniors who have excelled academically during their high school careers.

Award

The winner will be selected on the documentation and recommendations submitted. The winner will be honored in Spring 2021.

Eligibility

1. Must be a female high school senior
2. Must plan to pursue post high school studies (2 or 4 year college/university)
3. Must be a resident of a Dallas-Fort Worth county.
4. Must not plan to join another NPHC affiliated Sorority while receiving the award.

Josie Washington Memorial Scholarship

The Josie Washington Memorial Scholarship is in memory of a very devoted member of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Kappa Zeta Chapter. Josie Washington was an educator in the Dallas public schools, who taught much of her career at Lincoln High School. During her life she belonged to many organizations and volunteered her services wherever needed. Upon her death, Josie Washington left an endowment to her sorority. The Kappa Zeta chapter elected to set up a scholarship fund to honor her memory and generosity to our chapter.

Purpose

The scholarship is to be awarded to high school seniors who are considered “Unsung Heroes”: students who have overcome usual circumstances, performed humanitarian services or heroic deeds in the community, school or through their public or religious affiliations.

Award

The winner will be selected on the documentation and recommendations submitted. The winner will be honored in Spring 2021.

Eligibility

1. Must be a high school senior and a Dallas-Fort Worth County resident.
2. Must plan to pursue post high school studies (2 or 4 year college or accredited Technical/trade School).

Juanita Buchanan Undergraduate Academic Scholarship

The Juanita Buchanan Undergraduate Academic Scholarship is in memory of a very devoted member of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Kappa Zeta Chapter. During her life she belonged to many organizations and volunteered her services wherever needed. The Kappa Zeta chapter elected to set up a scholarship fund for collegiates to honor her memory to our chapter.

Purpose

The scholarship is to be awarded to a high school senior receiving dual college credit or an undergraduate matriculating at an accredited Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex college or university.

Award

The winner will be selected on the documentation and recommendations submitted. The winner will be honored in Spring 2021.

Eligibility

1. Must be a high school senior receiving dual college credit (minimum of 6 hours) or an undergraduate matriculating at an accredited Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex college or university (2 or 4 year)
2. Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.85
3. Must be involved in community service and/or organized campus activities
4. Must be a DFW resident.

Rhetta Washington McCoy Technology Scholarship

Purpose

The Rhetta Washington McCoy Technology scholarship is to be awarded to high school seniors who exhibits high academic standards and who does not have the technology to be successful at a 4 year college or university.

Award

The winner will be selected on the documentation and recommendations submitted and an interview. The winner will be honored in Spring 2021.

The winner will receive a scholarship for a technology bundle. There are two options.

- Option 1 consists of a laptop, carrying bag and 3 in 1 printer and 2 ink color(black/tri- color) print cartridges.
- Option 2 consists of a 3 in 1 printer, 2 ink color(black/tri-color) print cartridges, Microsoft Windows Suite and a flash drive.

Eligibility

1. Must be a high school senior.
2. Must plan to pursue post high school studies (4 year college).
3. Must be active in the community or other organizations.
4. Must be a resident of Dallas county.
5. Minimum GPA 2.5

Stork's Nest Scholarship

The scholarship is to be awarded to high school seniors or student with a GED who has completed the Storks Nest Education Program through Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., Kappa Zeta Chapter and the Stork's Nest Charity Fund of Dallas, a 501(c)3 non-profit organization.

Award

The winner will be selected on the documentation and recommendations submitted. The winner will be honored in Spring 2021.

Eligibility

1. Must have completed the Storks Nest Education Program through Kappa Zeta, Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc.
2. Must be a high school senior or completed GED within the last year prior to submitting an application.
3. Must plan to pursue vocational school, trade school, or 2 or 4 year college/university within 2 years of completing the Storks Nest Education Program.
4. Must be a resident of Dallas County.

Circle of Pearls

Purpose

The scholarship is to be awarded to African American female high school seniors who have excelled academically during their high school careers.

Award

The winner will be selected on the documentation and recommendations submitted. The winner will be honored in Spring 2021.

Eligibility

1. Must be an African American female high school senior
2. Must plan to pursue post high school studies (2 or 4 year college/university)
3. Must have a minimum GPA of 2.5
4. Must be a resident of a Dallas-Fort Worth County

Thelma J. Washington Woman of Conviction Award

This scholarly award is named in honor of Mrs. Thelma J. Washington, mother of Ms. Rhetta Washington McCoy. Mrs. Washington was a woman who exemplified immense integrity and one who stood firm on her personal convictions. Her strong belief in helping others and her community was an example for many to follow, particularly her daughters who continue her legacy of service to the community.

Purpose

This award is to assist a deserving African American female high school graduating senior, attending a Dallas ISD school, with furthering her educational pursuits beyond high school. The award is to be presented to a young woman who holds a strong belief in providing service to others and her community as exemplified through her actions, words and/or deeds, while maintaining high scholarly standards.

Award

The winner will be selected on the documentation and recommendations submitted. The winner will be honored in Spring 2021.

Eligibility

1. Must be an African American female
2. Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
3. Must be involved in community service activities
4. Must be a high school senior in the Dallas Independent School District

1. Must be an African American High School senior
2. Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0
3. Must be involved in community service and/or organized campus activities
4. Must have obtained a minimum of 200 hours of community service while in high school
5. Must be a student in the Dallas Independent School District
